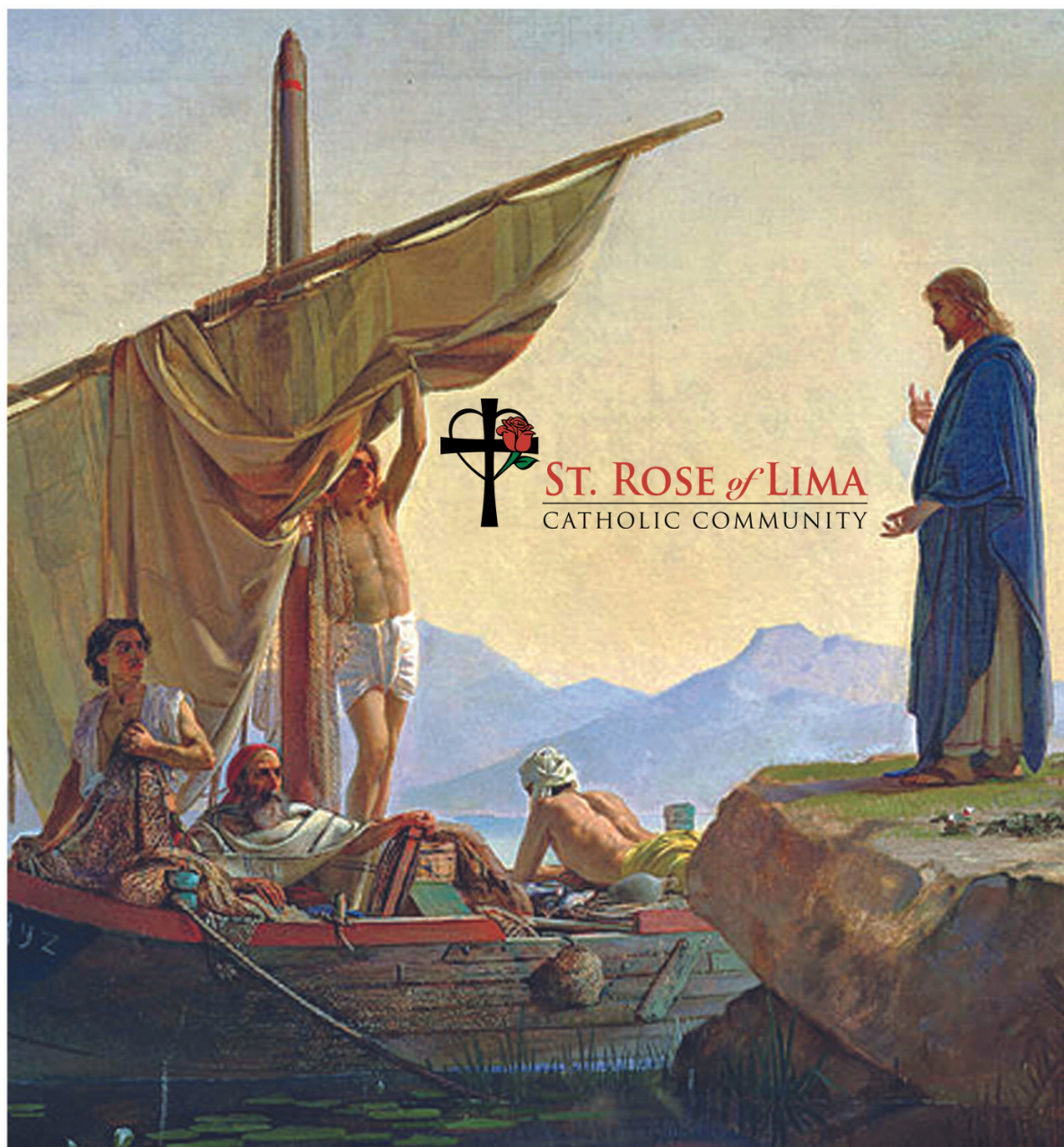

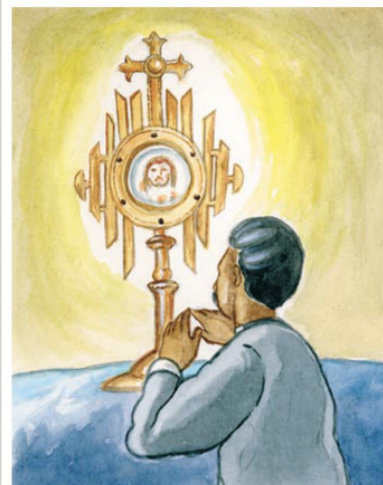

Eucharistic Miracle of **CHIRATTAKONAM**

ARCHDIOCESE OF TRIVANDRUM, INDIA, MAY 5, 2001



This Eucharistic miracle was verified recently, on May 5, 2001 in Trivandrum, India. In the Host there appeared the likeness of a man similar to that of Christ crowned with thorns. His Beatitude Cyril Mar Baselice, Archbishop of the diocese of Trivandrum, wrote regarding this prodigy: “[...] For us believers what we have seen is something that we have always believed [...]. If our Lord is speaking to us by giving us this sign, it certainly needs a response from us”. The monstrance containing the miraculous Host is to this day kept in the church.

The Rev. Fr. Johnson Karnoor, pastor of the church where the Eucharistic miracle took place, recounts in his deposition: April 28, 2001, in the parish church of St. Mary of Chirattakonam, we began the Novena to St. Jude Thaddeus as we did every year. At 8:49am, I exposed the Most Holy Sacrament in the monstrance for public adoration. After a few moments I saw what appeared to be three dots in the Holy Eucharist. I then stopped praying and began to look at the monstrance, also inviting the faithful to admire the three dots. I then asked the faithful to remain in prayer and reposed the monstrance in the tabernacle. On April 30th, I celebrated the Holy Mass and on the following day I left for Trivandrum. On Saturday morning, the 5th of May 2001, I opened the church for the usual liturgical

celebrations. I vested for Mass and went to open the tabernacle to see what had happened to the Eucharist in the monstrance. I immediately noted in the Host, a figure, to the likeness of a human face. I was deeply moved and asked the faithful to kneel and begin praying. I thought I alone could see the face so I asked the altar server what he noticed in the monstrance. He answered: ‘I see the figure of a man.’ I noticed that the rest of the faithful were looking intently at the monstrance.

“We began Adoration and as the minutes went by, the image became more and more clear. I did not have the courage to say anything and I began to cry. During Adoration, we have the practice of reading a passage from Holy Scriptures. The reading of

the day was the one from Chapter 20 in the Gospel of John, which narrates the story of when Jesus appeared to St. Thomas and asked him to look at the wounds. I was only able to say a few words in my homily, and, having to leave for the nearby parish of Kokkodu to celebrate Mass, I immediately summoned a photographer to take pictures of the Holy Eucharist with the human face on it. After two hours all the photos were developed; with the passing of the time the face in every photo became more and more clear.”

TIME OF FULFILLMENT

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It gives me great joy to write to you on this third Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel reading from Mark Chapter 1 gives us the opportunity to consider the Kingdom of God and to consider Jesus' call.

“This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel.” (Mk 1:15) Mark describes these words as the gospel of God; they tell us good news. Our salvation comes from God!

When Jesus says, “This is the time of fulfillment”, he is speaking of a decisive moment, of a turning point. He's referring to God's direct intervention. This is a time where God will fulfill his promises and will bring his plan of salvation to completion. In Jesus, God breaks into human history.

Jesus goes on. He says, “The kingdom of God is at hand.” God's kingdom is right here, right now. It is embodied in Jesus, own person. In addition, it exists wherever God's will is done. His will is completely fulfilled in heaven. And, it is fulfilled here on earth in every heart that surrenders to God. The words from the Lord's Prayer apply here. “Your Kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven” (Mt 6:10)

Jesus calls the people of Galilee and us to respond to the arrival of the Kingdom of God. He says, “Repent, and believe in the gospel.” Jesus asks us to turn back to him with all our hearts. He asks us to turn away from sin. He calls us to change our way of thinking and to change the priority of our lives.

Jesus calls us to faith with these words, “believe in the gospel.” We are to live the Gospel in order to bring about conversion and to make present the Kingdom of God. Through faith, anyone who chooses to can reach out and lay hold of it. The kingdom of God is so very close. The Gospel summarizes Jesus commands to his disciples: “love one another, even as I have loved you.”

St. Basil offers us a good summary. He writes, “A disciple is ... whoever draws near to the Lord to follow him -- to hear his words, to believe and obey him as Lord and king and doctor and teacher of truth... So, whoever believes in the Lord and presents himself ready for discipleship must first learn to set aside every sin and everything that distracts from obedience owed to the Lord.”

Brothers and sisters in Christ, let us ask the Lord in prayer to open our ears and our hearts to his call. Let us ask Jesus to help us become better disciples with each passing day. Amen.

Stewardship Saint for January - Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton

Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton was the first American to be canonized as a saint. She was raised Episcopalian, but later converted to Catholicism. Through the struggles and tragedies she faced in life, she remained devout. She is the founder of the first Catholic schools in the United States and is the patron saint of Catholic schools, widows, and seafarers. Born August 20, 1774 in New York, a wealthy Episcopalian who loved reading and charity work. Her father, Dr. Richard Bayley, was a doctor and one of the first health officials in New York City. Her mother, Catherine Charlton Bayley, died when Elizabeth was only three years old. At age nineteen, Elizabeth married William Magee Seton on January 25, 1794. Together they had five children, Anna Maria, William, Richard, Catherine, and Rebecca. Seton enjoyed a full life of loving service to her family, care for the underprivileged, and religious development in her Episcopal faith. In the late 1700s, a double tragedy visited Seton. The Seton family's life took a turn when her husband William became ill. He suffered from tuberculosis and continued to grow worse. Hoping to improve his health, the couple and their eldest daughter Anna Maria decided to go to Italy. On November 19th, they arrived in Leghorn and were placed in quarantine. They were released from quarantine on December 19th. William died 8 days later. Waiting to return to the United States, Seton and Anna Maria spent several months with the Filicchi brothers who were business associates of her husband. While in Italy, Seton learned about Roman Catholicism for the first time. She was especially drawn to the doctrine of the Eucharist as the real body of Christ. She returned to New York in June 1804. After her return, she continued to feel conflicted between the Episcopal and Catholic faiths. While in Emmitsburg, two of Seton's daughters died from tuberculosis, Anna Maria in 1812 and Rebecca in 1816. By that time, she herself was weak and increasingly subject to poor health. She spent the last years of her life directing St. Joseph's Academy and her growing community. She died January 4, 1821, at 46 years old. Although she passed away at a young age, Seton's legacy lived on. She life was declared holy (otherwise known as beatified) by Pope John XXIII on December 18, 1959. She was canonized, or officially made a saint, September 14, 1975, by Pope Paul VI. She was the first native-born saint of the United States.

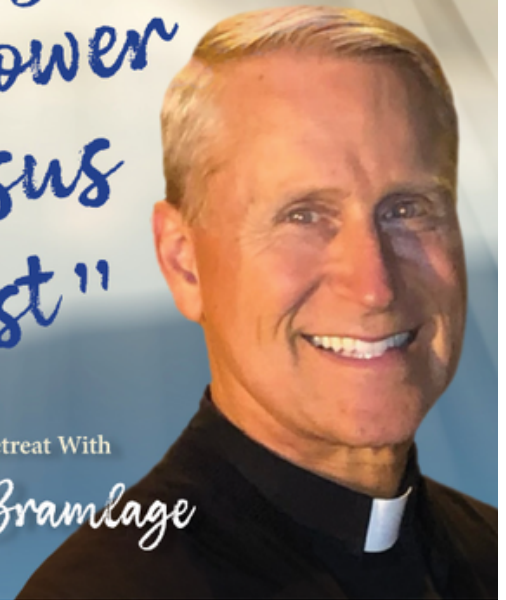

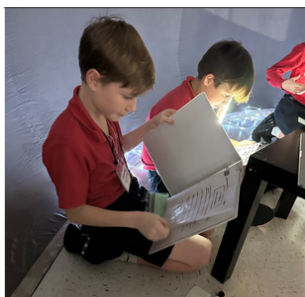
