EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES

Eucharistic Miracle of

ALBORAYA-ALMÁCERA


SPAIN, 1348

In 1348, a priest while on his way to visit some sick people in order to bring them Communion, slipped in the waters of a small river that he was crossing and overturned the ciborium which contained some consecrated Hosts. The poor priest, who had by now resigned himself to the loss, heard himself being called by some fishermen a short distance away inviting him to come closer to the shore in order to see several fish with discs in their mouth which appeared to be Hosts. The particles were immediately recovered and brought back to the church in a solemn procession in which the whole village participated.















n 1348, in the town of Alboraya-Almácera, a Eucharistic miracle occurred which seemed to recall episodes in the life of Saint Francis that demonstrate how, if men were to fully live in the grace of God, all God's creatures would live in harmony.

A priest, carrying a ciborium containing the Viaticum (sacrament) destined for some sick people, was crossing a river on mule-back when he was suddenly swept off his mount by a rushing wave. The priest tumbled into the water along with his ciborium, which was emptied of its precious content. The Hosts fell out and were being carried away by the current toward the mouth of the river nearby. The priest, barely saving himself, full of remorse, and lamenting what had occurred as he tried to free himself from the mud and the

waters, was approached by some fishermen who were stunned to have witnessed, in the place where the river water flowed into the sea, three fish, each with a little white disc in its mouth, resembling Communion Hosts.

The priest immediately ran to the church and returned to the river bank with another ciborium. He did everything in such a hurry, that he didn't even stop to ask himself if the fishermen's story was believable. Great was his joy when he saw that the three prodigious fish were there, almost completely out of the water, lifting the Hosts, intact, with their mouths, like little trophies. He fell to his knees, and extending his chalice, prayed as he had never prayed before in his entire life; and thus, he saw the fish deposit the Hosts in the chalice,

one after the other, and then dive and slither rapidly back into the water to disappear into the sea. Only at that moment did the priest notice that he was surrounded by a group of men and women who had witnessed the entire scene.

Today it is still possible to consult numerous documents testifying to the miracle. There even exists a small church, with two fish sculpted on the door, built on the site of the miracle, and two paintings reproducing the entire event.

PASTORAL LETTER FOR JANUARY

Dear Friends in Christ.

The Presentation of the Gifts in the Eucharistic celebration is a profound and meaningful moment that reminds us of our potential to do something truly divine as human beings. In this discussion, we will explore the rich symbolism of this ritual and its deep connection to our mission to make the world a better place. Through the simple elements of bread and wine, we express our commitment to live and work as Christ's representatives on earth, and elevate our understanding of our purpose in life.

At the heart of the Presentation of the Gifts is the transformation of ordinary bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. These elements symbolize the gift of ourselves that we made at our baptism when we were spiritually united to Jesus Christ. By offering these simple gifts, we renew our commitment to embody Christ's presence and mission on earth. This act reminds us that our purpose in life transcends the daily routine.

When we offer bread and wine for transformation, we go beyond the idea of working just to survive. Instead, we are engaging a profound reality - the "true bread" that comes from heaven and gives life to the world. This reminds us of our pursuit of eternal life as promised by God and awakens us to the spiritual dimension of our actions. It is in this spiritual reality that we find our true meaning in life.

The Eucharist teaches us that God can use ordinary things of the material world to produce divine effects. The simple "fruit of the earth" and the "work of human hands" become the "bread of life," while the "fruit of the vine" becomes our "spiritual drink." As we unite our humanity with Christ's divinity, we become instruments of divine fruitfulness, spreading God's life through our words and actions. This celebration reminds us that the divine is present in our daily lives.

The bread and wine we present symbolize not only the body and blood of Christ, but also ourselves. As these symbols pass through the congregation, each host represents an individual who offers himself or herself as a living sacrifice, echoing the commitment made at baptism. Our baptism made us partners with Jesus in his mission, and at each Mass we reaffirm our commitment to that mission.

As adults, we accept the mission of Jesus and the mission of the Church. Our baptism consecrates, commits, and empowers us to continue Christ's work as priest, prophet, and king. To fulfill our role as "prophets in the prophet," we must profess our faith not only in words, but in our daily actions that reflect the presence of the risen Jesus in us. In this journey, we receive the gift of the Holy Spirit to help us bear witness to our divine mission.

Finally, the presentation of the gifts is a powerful reminder of our divine mission on earth. Through symbols and rituals, we pledge to transform ourselves and the world around us. By participating in this sacrament, we acknowledge the true source of life, embrace our role as agents of divine change, and bear witness to our mission as prophets in the Prophet. It is in these moments of offering ourselves as living sacrifices that we fully understand the real world – the world in which God works through us, His human vessels, to bring about divine fruitfulness and eternal life.

Before I conclude, I invite you to consider a few questions:

- How does the presentation of the gifts during the Eucharist remind you of the potential for divine transformation within you and in the world around you?
- How can I be a bridge between heaven and earth, helping to make the kingdom of God a reality in our world?
- Reflect on the concept of offering yourself as a living sacrifice during the Eucharist. What practical steps can you take to renew this commitment in your life and work as an embodiment of Christ's presence on earth?

Queridos Amigos en Cristo,

La Presentación de los Dones en la celebración Eucarística es un momento profundo y significativo que nos recuerda nuestra posibilidad para hacer algo verdaderamente divino como seres humanos. En esta conversación, vamos a explorar el intenso simbolismo de este ritual y su profunda conexión con nuestra misión para crear del mundo un lugar mejor para vivir. A través del pan y el vino, expresamos nuestra dedicación a vivir У trabaiar representantes de Cristo en la Tierra, para elevar la comprensión de nuestro propósito en la vida.

La parte central de la Presentación de los Dones está en la transformación del pan y el vino en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Estos elementos simbolizan el regalo que hicimos nosotros mismos durante nuestro bautismo, cuando nos unimos espiritualmente a Jesucristo. Al presentar estos sencillos regalos, renovamos nuestro compromiso de encarnar la presencia y la misión de Cristo en la Tierra. Este acto nos recuerda que nuestro propósito en la vida va más allá de la vida diaria.

Cuando ofrecemos la transformación del pan y el vino, superamos nuestras intenciones y no solo para sobrevivir. Nos sumergimos en una realidad profunda: el "verdadero pan" que viene del cielo y da vida al mundo. Esto nos recuerda nuestro seguimiento de la vida eterna, como la prometió Dios, y nos despierta a la dimensión espiritual de nuestras acciones. Es en esta realidad espiritual donde encontramos nuestro verdadero propósito en la vida.

La Eucaristía nos enseña que Dios puede usar objetos mundanos para crear resultados divinos. El "fruto de la tierra" y el "trabajo del hombre" se convierten en el "pan de vida", y el "fruto de la vid" se convierte en nuestra "bebida espiritual". Cuándo unimos nuestra humanidad con la divinidad de Cristo, nos convertimos en instrumentos de fertilidad divina, difundiendo la vida de Dios a través de nuestras palabras y acciones. Esta celebración nos recuerda que lo divino está presente en nuestra vida diaria.

Como adultos, aceptamos la misión de Jesús y la de la Iglesia. Nuestro bautismo nos consagró, comprometió y empoderó para continuar la obra de Cristo como sacerdotes, profetas y reyes. Para cumplir nuestra responsabilidad como "profetas en el Profeta", debemos profesar nuestra fe no solo con palabras, sino a través de nuestras acciones diarias, reflejando la presencia de Jesús resucitado dentro de nosotros. En esta jornada, recibimos el don del Espíritu Santo para ayudarnos a dar testimonio de nuestra misión divina.





Spring 2024 Nullity Case Sponsor Training

The Metropolitan Tribunal is pleased to announce its next formational training program of 36 hours for Nullity Case Sponsors, heartily supported by Daniel Cardinal DiNardo. Training will be held at St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church, 6800 Buffalo Spwy., Houston, TX 77025. Every parish is encouraged to have trained Nullity Case Sponsors. As always, priests and deacons are welcome to attend these sessions, but registration is required due to limited space. For deacons, this training can be applied toward continuing education hours that are required by the Office of the Diaconate. Pastor's approval is required for lay people. Lay people are to be chosen carefully by the pastor and are to possess certain qualities that are necessary for this service. The lay person is to understand and adhere to the teachings of the Church in general but specifically to the Catholic theology of marriage; be in good standing with the Church; be discrete and non-judgmental; have common sense and critical thinking skills; be patient and have good communication skills; and have ample time to serve in this capacity. To qualify to serve as a Nullity Case Sponsor, one must complete all 36 hours of training.

A simultaneous Spanish translation will be offered. Individual must use his/her own cell phone and headphones. Charges may incur due to minute usage.

The training will be held at St. Vincent de Paul Church on the following six Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

• Course 1: January 13 and 20

• Course 2: February 3 and 10

• Course 3: March 16 and 23




