

SAINT STANISLAUS KOSTKA

1550-1568

Saint Stanislaus Kostka, at the age of seventeen, was so gravely ill that he seemed very near the end of his life. In that time, he lived as the guest of a noble Protestant who would not even permit him to be visited by a Catholic priest. Stanislaus was not discouraged and one night, in the presence of his tutor, he received Communion in a miraculous way. A few days later he recovered and decided to enter the Jesuit order.

NATIONAL VOCATION AWARENESS WEEK

National Vocation Awareness Week (NVAW) - (Nov 5 - 11).

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus,

The Holy Catholic Church observes every Fourth Sunday of Easter (Good Shepherd Sunday) as The World Day of Prayer for Vocations when the Church reads the Gospel passage of the Good Shepherd (John 10:1-10). The purpose of World Day of Prayer for Vocations is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2).

In 1976 The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) decided to dedicate one week to pray for vocations as National Vocation Awareness Week (NVAW). From 2014 onwards the first full week of November is NVAW. This annual observance of the Catholic Church in the United States is designed to focus on vocations to the priesthood, religious life and diaconate. It is a time to encourage young people to ask themselves: "To what vocation in life is God calling me?" It is also an opportunity to bring awareness to and pray for those already in discernment of one of these vocations.

"VOCATION IS A GRACE AND MISSION":

POPE FRANCIS REMINDS IN HIS MESSAGE FOR VOCATIONS SUNDAY 2023.

In his message for the World Day of Prayer for Vocations 2023, Pope Francis said God's call to a particular vocation also includes the mission to offer one's life for others. "God's call," the pope said, "includes a 'sending.' There is no vocation without a mission. In his message, he emphasized that the Church's vocations – lay, priesthood, religious, or consecrated life – work together in a harmonious symphony. Dear friends,

Ten Good Reasons to go to Mass #6 "People Need Our Prayers" All of us at one time or another have listened to someone who is having problems of some sort. And in most cases, doing what we can to help in the moment, we also promise the troubled person that we will pray for them. Praying for others and their needs can be done at any time, but there is something special about praying for someone in the setting of the Mass. Whether someone is distant from us or perhaps we have been separated by death, prayers on behalf of other spoken during Mass touch the heart of God in a very powerful way. During the General Intercessions or Prayers of the Faithful which conclude the Liturgy of the Word, we pray for people everywhere, many of who we have never met and will probably never meet. Father Eduardo Rivera, CSB is a priest of the Congregation of St. Basil (Basilian Fathers). He is the chaplain of the University of St. Thomas, Vocations Director, and Director of Scholastics for the Basilian Fathers. Fr. Rivera is an alumnus of the University of St. Thomas and native of Houston. His family attended Mass while he was a student at the University of St Thomas. It was during his time working in campus ministry and studying theology at the university that Fr. Rivera discovered his vocation to the priesthood and religious life. There were so many options for religious orders that Fr. Eduardo felt overwhelmed in discerning what path to take. But with the help of his spiritual director, family and friends, he discovered that he found his calling to be a priest and an educator. The Basilian Fathers minister primarily in schools such as St. Thomas High School and the University of St Thomas. Fr. Eduardo felt called to help others learn about Christ and encounter him through education.

NATIONAL VOCATIONS AWARENESS WEEK

HOUSTON VOCATIONS: A LOOK INTO THE PRIESTHOOD



In 2023, 12 young men joined the seminary for the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston. Each man studies between 7-9 years before being ordained a transitional deacon and then, God willing, a priest. To the left is an image of St. Mary's Seminary, located on Memorial Drive.

Seminary is broken up into four stages: propaedeutic, discipleship, configuration, and vocational synthesis. The propaedeutic stage lasts about one year. The term comes from a Greek word meaning "before studies". Typically, a young man works at a parish while in this stage. The discipleship stage can last between 2-4 years. By the end of this stage, those who are sure of their calling from God to be a priest receive the installation as a candidate for Holy Orders. The configuration stage is about 3.5-4.5 years long. The focus of this stage is to live out their vocation to holiness during the last few years of seminary. At the end of this stage, seminarians graduate from seminary and are ordained transitional deacons. The last 6 months of formation is called the vocational synthesis stage. These men serve as deacons in parishes transitioning from seminary life to full-time ministry in the diocese.





Studies have shown that more than 70% of priests were former altar servers. This shows the importance of young men serving at the altar assisting the priest, being involved in one of the greatest moments on earth: the Mass.

What do you do at your parish and within your family to foster a culture of vocations? Have you ever considered asking a young person what mission God is calling them to rather than what they want to be when they grow up? Teaching the youth to listen and respond to God's voice will change the world. How do you do that? We suggest prayer and silence.

To the right are some of the men who entered seminary in June 2023. The Office of Vocations receives most applicants in the Spring, thoroughly reviews their application, set up interviews, then, pending the Cardinal's approval, are officially seminarians of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston. Did you know you can go to seminary right after high school? Some of the young men who have not yet attended college go to Holy Trinity in Dallas for their first few years of seminary to earn their undergraduate degree in philosophy.

The Importance of Parental Reverence

"In 1959, in Houston, they had 100 seminarians (men studying to be priests). That's the most we've had since then even though the population of Catholics has increased by almost 500%. We now have 46 seminarians and 1.7 million Catholics.

There is no Eucharist without priests, so if you care at all about having the Eucharist in the future, something needs to change. I think the solution might be simpler than we think. I asked my dad once what he thought was the best thing parents could do to encourage vocations. He said parents should receive communion with reverence. He's right. If we receive communion like it's just a piece of bread, why would a young man give up his life for that? Why give up everything and be celibate for a piece of bread? But, if we receive the Eucharist with the reverence it deserves, as the True Body of Jesus, then a young man will see that too. I would especially challenge fathers. You will have the greatest spiritual influence on your children. Your sons need to see that the Eucharist is the most important thing in your life based on your example. Your sons need to know that the Eucharist will be worth giving their life for."

"I carried this separation pain during the early years of my daughter's formation days. Having grown up in the church pre-Vatican II with very strict German nuns as my teachers, I couldn't envision having that for my daughter. That was the only thing I could relate to. BUT 5 years later, I was able to experience through my daughter and what she was doing in religious life the beauty of the gift that she received. I could see her happiness, I could see how content she was, and how deep down she knew in her heart [that] this call is exactly what she was called to live. She is in community with such beautiful sisters that I would never want to take her away from that. What I tell parents is to pray, pray, pray for your child. Be a prayer warrior for your child. Get out of God's way. Let God work through your children."
